

# LUCAS JOHNSON


oming from a family that plays a lot of golf and knows about golf, it was set in stone Lucas Johnson would be playing the lifelong sport as well. Lucas is a 2017 Shanley grad who is best known as one of Shanley's top golfers during his time there. From the people closest to him, the word nerd gets thrown around a lot due to his Star Wars knowledge, but they also describe him as a good listener, intelligent, and caring.


#### **Career at Shanley**

Not only did his family participate in golf, but many of them also went to Shanley High School. Lucas mentioned there is a long line of family from his dad's side that attended Shanley, which include his dad and his siblings, and his grandpa. His grandpa, Don Johnson coached the boys and girls golf teams for many years, more than thirty on the boys' side. Don's wife and Lucas's grandma, Carolyn also coached the girls. Lucas did nothing but improve in his high school golf career and had many accomplishments. As a freshman, Lucas had a regular season average of 82 and was part of the team that achieved the state title. In 2015, he improved his average to 78.5, which was fifth in the EDC and was a part of the runner-up team. His junior year, his average lowered to 75 and climbed his way up to third in the EDC. The team also won the state championship that year. His senior year, he finished with an incredible regular season average of 73.14, which was second in the EDC. Lucas also participated in football, band, Shanley TV, hockey, choir, student ambassadors, and student council. Lucas had a lot of favorite memories about Shanley, but one in particular would be participating in Shanley TV with Jed Thomas. "It was a ton of fun to be up in the booth with him and get to call such a wide variety of sports. Specifically, the Shanley versus St. Mary's football game was probably my favorite." Lucas represented Shanley by showing excellence not only in the game of golf, but by acting as a deacon to those around him. He gave some insight into what he learned from going to school at Shanley, "Shanley's taught me how important it is to give back and to help out in the community. It's a great way to strengthen my relationships and build new ones."

#### Other Golf Accomplishments

In the summers of his high school years, Lucas had even more success on the golf course. In 2015 and 2016, he was the Fargo Moorhead Junior All City Champion and qualified for the IMG World Junior Tournament at Torrey Pines in California. This tournament is known as one of the most prestigious





international events for juniors in the world. In addition, he was a three-time Minnesota PGA Valspar Junior Tour Champion and eight-time Steve Weidner F-M Junior Tour Champion.

#### **Continuing Success at NDSU**

Lucas Johnson, a senior, is now currently on the NDSU golf team. His hard work and determination have continued to grow, and it is shown through his accomplishments. Coming in as a freshman, there were eight members on the team including Lucas and the top four competed in all eleven tournaments, Lucas was one of them. During this year, he had a pair of top ten finishes, one of which was at the Summit League Men's golf Championship that the team won. He posted a career-low-three-round score of three over par 216, shot a season best round score of one under par seventy, and more. The next season, as a sophomore Lucas ranked third of the team and shot another season low of 69. His junior year, he ranked third on team with an average of 73.53 over fifteen rounds, which is the tenth best average in school history. Again, he continued to improve his career best to 68 and had a top ten finish, placing tied for sixth. Lucas ranks fourth in NDSU history with a 74.53 career stroke average. NDSU golf did not compete later that spring due to COVID-19 and only played in one event this past fall. Lucas does plan to continue to compete for one more year due to the pandemic and said, "Coach Kennedy was gracious enough to have me back and it's tough to say no to another year of traveling the country to play golf."

#### **Relationship with His Grandpa**

Lucas Johnson was very lucky to be coached by his grandpa, Don Johnson, and he continues to use the lessons he learned from him, not only in golf but in everyday life. "Oh man, there's so many lessons from him. Golf related it would be that golf is just a game. Gotta learn to have fun with it. I think this can be said for any sport. There's so much more to life than a sport and the purpose of the sport is to have

fun. In life, it wasn't so much what he said but just how he lived, is that last couple weeks when he was sick there was an opportunity for him to do things he always wanted to do and go places he wanted to go. When we asked, all he said that he wanted to spend it with his family. He lived his life to the fullest while he could. Then when it mattered most, he just wanted to be with family. That's what mattered most to him. I'll never forget the last hole I played with him; he was stilling giving putting lessons until he couldn't stand. I switched my grip because of him. He was a heck of a guy."

#### Faith, Academics, After College

Faith is a big part of Lucas' life, and he uses it in the game of golf as well. "Faith has definitely been a strong part in my golf life. Golf is such a frustrating game and is so inconsistent. But faith is the opposite. It's so constant and there's always someone to listen. I think it is a great way to escape from all the emotions of golf and just relax." # SHANLEY TV

atching live sports on television has been an American tradition for a very long time. Everyone enjoys watching their favorite superstars or sports teams make incredible plays to score points for their side, and even watch it all crumble as the other team makes a stunning comeback. What we might never have imagined is that the tradition of sports broadcasting would one day be brought to the high school sports scene. But that's exactly what Shanley student Gabe Thomas did when he founded Shanley TV in 2015, alongside its advisor Shari McTaggart. Shanley TV has been a largely student-run broadcasting organization for Shanley's many high school sports for five years now, while Shari McTaggart, and later Jim Picard in 2018, watch over it all.

But it all began with one student: Gabe Thomas. He presented the idea of broadcasting sports, and got permission to do a basketball using his own camera and equipment. But if course, it grew far beyond that. To create something that would outlive his enrollment at Shanley, Thomas went to the Shanley Athletic Club, namely Athletic Director Michael Breker, to get funding for Shanley TV's own equipment. Mr. Breker saw a great opportunity for both students, and a way to promote the school, and spoke with the SAC who unanimously granted the necessary funds. It started with just four members, but the program picked up steam and has grown today to roughly 30 active members. The equipment has also been upgraded with time, including the addition of an advanced tricaster that greatly improved Shanley TV broadcasting, and now matches that of local professionals.

Shanley TV today has some impressive numbers. So far we have broadcasted over 200 events from football to hockey, and 29 of those have occurred in just the fall of 2020. 46 games are projected to be broadcasted during this winter, including boys' basketball, girls' basketball, and hockey. Our crew boasts around 30 members as well as our two advisors. In the fall of 2020, we reached one million minutes watched, and that number has grown significantly reaching 1.7 million minutes watched later on in the year.

These numbers show the increasing value of a high school broadcasting network during a pandemic situation. With only a few spectators allowed, watching online has become the prime alternative, which is likely why we've seen such a rapid increase in minutes watched as of late. Friends and family may not be able to make it to see their athletes play due to the limited

seating, or simply because of other various circumstances. Shanley TV brings the game to you wherever you have internet access, so that social distancing doesn't have to stop you from watching the people and games you love to see.

As for the activity itself, Shanley TV has a wide variety of positions and people involved in the production of its broadcasts. One position is the tricaster operator, who is responsible for which camera angles are seen by the viewer, as well as displaying the graphics like the scoreboard or advertisements. The scoreboard tech keeps track of everything going on via the scoreboard, including points and time. Two camera operators work together to bring interesting visual angles of the game. And lastly the color and play by play announcers work together to add vocal excitement to the match.

My journey with Shanley TV has only begun this year. My name is Jeremiah Moore, and I've been doing play by play for a couple of games now. As an avid public speaker, I was more than happy to seize yet another opportunity to share my voice with the world, and Shanley TV has given me a platform to do so. This activity means a lot to me, and everyone watching at home. Thanks for all your support, and I think I speak for all of Shanley TV when I say that we'll always continue to improve and do our best to bring Shanley sports to you!

## THE SHIELD

#### THE DEACONS

Our nickname, "Deacons," was adopted in the fall of 1934 for the teams of Sacred Heart Academy, forerunner of Shanley High School, and has been used ever since.

It is especially fitting for Catholic schools, since it is derived from the Greek and literally means "servants" or "those who serve" (Acts 6). The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us that Jesus "made Himself the 'Deacon' or servant of all" (CCC 1570).

In light of our schools' mission, identity, and nickname, we expect our students to excel in serving God and neighbor.



#### THE SHIELD

The Shanley Shield first appeared on football helmets in the fall of 1973. It was designed by Shanley art teacher Sr. Mary Virginia Deibert, PBVM with the help of her art students.

The shield signifies strength. The cross of Christ is centered on the shield as it is the center of our Catholic faith. The "S" represents "Shanley" high school, named for Bishop John Shanley (1852-1909), who served as first bishop of the Fargo Catholic Diocese.
