SO IT HAS BEEN for 2020 Shanley High School Graduate, Jerica Friese.

In 2009, when Jerica was 7 years old, family friend and Moorhead High School, UND and NHL Hockey player Chris Vandevelde invited her and her parents to a hockey game in Grand Forks (or, at the Ralph Engelstad Arena). On the ride home, as she recalled the experience and action, Jerica told her parents, "I want to play hockey."

Nobody told her she was three or four years behind her peers. That fact seemed immaterial, as Jerica just wanted to play. Because of this so-called late start, Jerica knew at that young age she needed to catch up to those peers and spent the next few seasons and summers attending every hockey camp her and her family could find.

Once Jerica was old enough, she began coaching at some of those camps mainly to get extra ice-time to hone her skills. It didn't take her long to realize how much she enjoyed the game's coaching aspect, "I just love working with young girls." She followed her love for hockey through the youth ranks with the Fargo Freeze, and into high school where she played for the Fargo North/South/Shanley/Oak Grove Co-op. "My 14U coach, Dean Wilson, had the most influence on my hockey career. He pushed me to believe in myself. Every day I got to the rink he made sure I knew he cared about me as a person, and that I could achieve my goals."

As she developed her skills as a hockey player, the challenges continued. "High School hockey was a learning process for me. I had to work my way up from the 4th line my Sophomore year," Friese recalls. "We lost to Bismarck in the State Championship my Sophomore and Junior year (in OT) to Britta Curl (now with Team USA) and Bismarck. Our senior year, there were a bunch of girls who left our high school team to play on a AAA team. That experience gave me and the other girls a great



opportunity to step into leadership roles," said Friese.

Jerica led her team in scoring her senior year with 25 goals and 17 assists for 42 points, good enough to rank third in the state. They finished in 5th Place at State in 2020. That extra time, dedication, and focus on improving her skill-set landed her a college hockey offer at Concordia College-Moorhead. She committed to Concordia, as she recalls, on "the day after the world was shut down for COVID."

"COVID cut my freshman year at Concordia short. We only played five games that year. "It was crazy," Friese recalls. "We had to practice in shifts, 10 players at a time in pods. I was lucky enough to be one of only two freshmen to dress every game." Jerica's sophomore year, she was the leading scorer on the team and earned First Team All-MIAC. A fact that she humbly accepts, "I don't know where that came from."

Her junior year Jerica recalls mixed results. "We scored some goals and had a good team," Friese reflects, "but we finished last in the MIAC Conference." This season is a rebuilding year, as they begin this season under the direction of a new coach.

Jerica's development as a person also occurred off the ice. Jerica's 5th-grade teacher at Nativity, Nancy Riveland, impacted her as a teacher and role-model. "She had a huge influence on me. She was so creative and fun, and we learned so much," Friese recalls. "That experience made me think that I could be a teacher someday." "She is so inspirational. I owe a lot to Mrs. Riveland."


Jerica highlighted her experience at JPII Schools. "Nativity, (Sacred Heart) Middle School, and Shanley High School have had such a positive influence on me and my family. "I learned at Shanley to treat others with love and respect regardless of where they are in their lives or faith journey." Jerica still attends Mass every Sunday with her parents. "Attending JPII Schools has made



me a more faithful person. I would not be where I am today had I not attended JPII."

Up next for Jerica is to finish her Senior Hockey season at Concordia and graduate with a degree in Elementary Education. Due to COVID and the shortened 2020-21 season, this year's seniors are eligible to play an extra year. Jerica plans on taking advantage of that for the 2024-25 season. Her ultimate goal is to be a Division-1 college hockey coach.

From knowing she wanted to play hockey the first game she watched, to knowing she wanted to be a teacher from her experience in Mrs. Riveland's class, to knowing she wanted to coach after spending a few summers coaching young girls at hockey camps, one truth has been discovered; when she sets her mind to something, whether it's scoring goals or pursuing dreams, she will accomplish it.


BETH BUE MAHER Head Coach

Roundball Renewal:

A PAIR OF NEW HEAD COACHES LEAD SHANLEY BASKETBALL

NEW HEAD COACHES are common in high school athletics, but a change of the guard in leadership for both boys' and girls' basketball in the same season is anything but ordinary.

So it is for Shanley as Stefan Webber and Beth Bue Maher guide the Deacons. In both cases, the pair are familiar faces in the community. One is home-grown Deacon, while the other saw her hoop dreams land her in Fargo.

CLIMBING STEFAN'S LADDER

Stefan Webber wore the Deacon uniform in his youth, playing for Leon Knodel and graduating from Shanley in 2011. As a Senior, his leadership qualities took root as he teamed up with younger players A.J. Jacobson and Patrick Strom who would eventually lead Shanley to a state title in 2013.

At the age of 20, he became the coach of the 7th Grade B Team at Sacred Heart. "I literally climbed the ladder here on campus and from there it was the 7A team and then the 8th grade teams, Freshman, JV, and ten years later here I am."

Through his journey, as a basketball coach and football assistant coach, Webber has operated with



one core philosophy. "I always tell the kids, 'How we do one thing is how we do everything'. If we get that mindset instilled, it leads to how we conduct ourselves on and off the court," Webber shares. "I want the team to think beyond scoring, but about the little things like setting screens, and execution."

Webber credits many mentors through the years and working as a part of Craig Irwin's staff last year was instrumental to his development. "He's been helpful all along, even in this off-season," Webber notes. "He's been a great mentor for schematic things with day-to-day planning in the midst of a season."

And whether it's day to day or year by year for Webber, it's all about incremental steps to success. And that same patient philosophy will be a key for the upcoming season. "There is a standard for Shanley and our goal is to make it to the State Tournament, as it should be every year." Webber believes that timing will need to be everything with only two Varsity players returning to a roster that saw seven Seniors graduate in 2023. "We will grow and players will need to rise up," Webber adds. "The bar shouldn't be moved because that is the standard at Shanley."

And as the new keeper of that standard, Webber will use Deacon tradition as fuel. "Being around some of

those talented players from a decade ago, I have a good handle on what it takes to be at that level," Webber says. "As a football coach, it is a good parallel reminder to keep communicating those things because they are very transferable."

And for this year's team, they will personify the journey of their coach who appreciates that rewards and fulfillment often come from the climb.

CULTIVATING CULTURE

Beth Bue Maher knows about being a part of a successful program. The key elements she absorbed at NDSU under Amy Ruley in the early 2000s are now instilled in the Deacons girls' basketball program and through drive, focus, and inspiration, it appears the sky's the limit.

A four-year starter in high school in Austin, MN, Beth also played for the North Tartan AAU program in Minneapolis. The long travel for practice and tournaments as one of the best 16U teams in the country promised plenty of D1 scholarships to come. But a torn ACL her junior year saw those potential offers dry up and only D2 schools, namely North Dakota State, kept the communication flowing. "I will never forget that commitment they had in me," Bue Maher recalls," and when it came time to make a decision it was a no-brainer to go to NDSU because they stuck with me through my injury."

Bue Maher would re-injure her ACL just before coming to NDSU so she needed to redshirt and her early career with the Bison got off to a rocky start as her playing time was limited. "I contemplated transferring after my sophomore year, but I stuck it out," Bue Maher remembers. "My junior year against UND I hit three three-pointers, and I started the rest of my time at NDSU."

Bue Maher made All-Conference her last two years at NDSU and she met and married Bison Linebacker Jared Maher. She started to coach and teach at Dilworth Glyndon-Felton but she declined the head coaching job early on as she felt she needed a break from being all-in on basketball. But the wife and mother of five never fully closed the door on coaching.

Bue Maher started to intensify her focus on coaching when her oldest daughter Annabelle picked up the sport and she developed her successful Bolts travel team. Shanley head coach Steve Jacobson asked her to be a part of his staff at Shanley, coaching the C Team. Before long, Bue Maher started to see the quality and character of the athletes she was leading and the time was right for her and her family to apply for the head coaching role when it became available after last season.

"These girls (at Shanley) have been so nice, kind, and receptive to feedback. When the head job came up, I went for it."

As she considered the leap, Bue Maher recalled the program she was once a part of and how she wanted to bring that to Shanley. "The culture and pride that Coach Ruley instilled, I wanted to be a part of that community then and bring it here now," Bue Maher adds. "When I was contemplating applying, I reached out to Coach Ruley and she was one of my advocates to go for it."

Now onboard, Bue Maher looks to make her mark on a program with a proud tradition of its own. "I'm being purposeful to coach them as a whole person," she says. "Good people with good self-esteem, good students, friends and members of the community. And it's important that I and my staff model that."

This season Bue Maher would like to see the team grow and not only compete but triumph over quality teams in the EDC. "Steve did a good job developing this program and I think this team has the tools and talent to be among the best," Bue Maher says. "With new systems implemented it may take some time for us to develop."

And taking pride in the legacy of Shanley basketball is something that Bue Maher looks to develop. "We have the most state championships in basketball (10) than any other school in the state. We have four Miss Basketballs. Other than Football, we have more state championships in girls' basketball than any other sport at Shanley."

For the new coach, the plan extends beyond this season. "We're focused on the younger girls we're developing and our 3x3 Sisters Tournament is a fitting tribute to the Sisters of the Presentation," Bue Maher adds. "We have legacies and traditions that some of the newer schools around us don't have."

Incorporating the proud past, developing the whole athlete, and building a culture for tomorrow.




FOOTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

THE FLAME

The Flame represents the Holy Spirit and the light of faith and knowledge. A lantern flame is also a traditional symbol of the Sisters of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, founders of our Catholic schools.

THE SEQUELA CHRISTI

"Following Christ"

St. John Paul II tells us; "at the heart of catechesis we find, in essence, a Person, the Person of Jesus of Nazareth, the only Son from the Father...full of grace and truth, who suffered and died for us and who now, after rising, is living with us forever. It is Jesus who is the way, and the truth, and the life, and Christian living consists in following Christ, the sequela Christi."



THE CROSS

The Cross represents Christ. It is the focal point of our belief: Jesus died on the cross to redeem humanity. The cross calls us to offer our sufferings and sacrifices for God, family, and neighbor. At the foot of the cross is Mary.

St. John Paul II was well known for having a deep and abiding love for the Blessed Virgin Mary. His devotion to her was evident in all that he did: his teaching, his prayer life, even his papal motto and coat of arms were dedicated to the Blessed Mother. **Totus Tuus** - "I totally belong to you."

THE DEACONS

Our nickname, "Deacons," was adopted in the fall of 1934 for the teams of Sacred Heart Academy, forerunner of Shanley High School, and has been used ever since.

It is especially fitting for Catholic schools, since it is derived from the Greek and literally means "servants" or "those who serve" (Acts 6). The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us that Jesus "made Himself the 'Deacon' or servant of all" (CCC 1570).

In light of our schools' mission, identity, and nickname, we expect our students to excel in serving God and neighbor.

THE SHIELD



THE SHIELD

The Shanley Shield first appeared on football helmets in the fall of 1973. It was designed by Shanley art teacher Sr. Mary Virginia Deibert, PBVM with the help of her art students.

The shield signifies strength. The cross of Christ is centered on the shield as it is the center of our Catholic faith. The "S" represents "Shanley" high school, named for Bishop John Shanley (1852-1909), who served as first bishop of the Fargo Catholic Diocese.

Graduation from Shanley High School is the capstone for the St. John Paul II Catholic Schools student experience as Deacons.
