

RIGHT ON FRACK

JPII's Sprint to Victory Project Continues to Progress Despite Weather Delays

The goal of having the first track in school history along with a new turf field in place in time for the 2023/2024 school year is well within reach.


Despite a winter in the region that would not release its grip, crews will begin to work on the property, starting with removing the current turf surface, in late April. Later in the spring, landscaping and cement work will be completed in phases, all in hopes of having the new surfaces in place in time for the new school year in late August. "Originally, we hoped to possibly break ground in early April and we had August 1 as our target goal so we could have the grounds for fall practice," Activities Director Reggie Jackson noted, "we now hope to be ready in time for our home openers."

Shanley's first Varsity Football game is August 25th vs. Bismarck High. The first Varsity Soccer match is August 29th vs. Grand Forks Central. "We'd really like to celebrate the new grounds at Homecoming vs. West Fargo Sheyenne on September 15th," Jackson said.

Network officials shared in early April that the original \$1.5 million goal has been satisfied and the focus now shifts to a final fundraising goal.

"We have evaluated the bids for the turf to create the highest quality, longest lasting field with all the needed enhancements for safety and playability," JPII Director of Advancement John Klocke said. "To add all of the necessary equipment for turf and track will cost \$1.9 million bringing the total project cost to \$3.4 million." Klocke noted that with \$2.1 million in the school expansion fund, it leaves a \$1 million goal in cash and pledges to raise by September 30th.

Among other amenities, the additional funding will be used to move the current lighting and to add new LED lighting for both the turf and track. A new drainage system is required, and the option exists to extend the turf warranty from ten years to twelve years or more and the track surface can be upgraded from a 10 year life to a



20 year life. Klocke also noted that up to \$400,000 in equipment will need to be purchased to create a fully competitive track program, including fiberoptic timing equipment, hurdles, pits, and blocks.

"The new turf, track, and materials are all complete and ready to go," Klocke said, "there is no waiting game involved there."

Jackson shared that when the old field turf is harvested in the spring, they will try to remove the centerpiece Shanley shield for safekeeping. Other sections of the turf will be preserved and turned into memorabilia upon removal. "Many athletes have grown on that field for more than a decade," Jackson said, "I am sure there are some of them, and parents as well, who would like a piece of those memories."



In hockey she earned All EDC, All Tournament, and All State Teams several times while playing in three state championship games. In Track and Field, she won the Class A State Long Jump 3 times as a 7th, 9th, and 10th grader and currently holds the long jump school record at Red River High School (18'10") and Shanley (19'2").

Currently: Junior at North Dakota State University; majoring in pharmaceutical sciences and will be starting NDSU's Doctor of Pharmacy Program in the fall of 2023. Grace competes in the long jump and the triple jump on NDSU's track and field team.

What are some of the accomplishments you have achieved at NDSU?



Last year I was an NCAA Preliminary Rounds Qualifier in the

long jump and took 21st place out of the West Region. At the 2023 Indoor Summit League Championships, I won the long jump, took 3rd in the triple jump, and received Field MVP. I am fifth on the outdoor top ten list in the long jump and third on the indoor top ten list for NDSU. So far, my personal bests are 20' 3.75" in the long jump and 40' 1.5" in the triple jump.

As a 2020 high school graduate, COVID resulted in the cancelation of your senior track season. How did that impact you and your track career moving forward?

I was grateful I had already committed to NDSU before that season; however, everyone still had a lot riding on that season, whether it was meeting personal goals before graduation or hitting marks that would advance you to competing at the collegiate level. The weeks that followed held a lot of uncertainty. Many of us were training at our homes or local parks, hoping the track season would resume. I was on my own training for the following track season at NDSU. This was very scary as I didn't know what to expect from college athletics or if we would have a season the following year. Luckily, we were able to resume practice on campus in the fall of my freshman year. It was far less scary once I was on campus; I wasn't alone.

How has participating in collegiate track impacted you?

Participating in track at a collegiate level has taught me a lot about myself, responsibility, and time management. It has also taught me how to prioritize what's most important to me. Not being able to do everything is okay; you must do what you love. Being a junior now, I have also had the opportunity to step into a leadership role. I remember how scary it was and how it felt to be under the pressure of college athletics as a freshman. I know how important it is to have people you can count on surrounding you and recognize that your personal worth is completely separate from an athletic career.

Who/what has been instrumental in your track success?

Something that really turned my career around was when I started just having fun. Coming off the 2020 lack of a track season and being a freshman, I put immense pressure on myself to produce personal bests in my events. Triple jump was a brand-new event for me, and there was a lot of room for growth in long jump. I felt a lot of pressure to perform well to receive more competition opportunities. I had a rough freshman season, and it looked like my sophomore season would end up the same way. Near the end of my sophomore indoor season, we were competing at Iowa State, and I was so grateful I had made the travel roster. At that meet, I decided I wasn't having much fun in track with all this pressure I was putting on myself and told myself I didn't care how I did. All I knew was that I loved track and was grateful to be at that meet. It was a breakthrough for me to take that pressure off myself, and I ended up jumping personal bests for the season in long jump and triple jump at that meet!

What advice do you have for Shanley athletes?

In any sport, JUST HAVE FUN. What they say about time flying by, stopping and smelling the roses, or enjoying the journey is true. You'll never find success or results in unhappiness. Play the sports you love, don't focus all your time and energy on one thing, and just be present in what you love. My biggest regret was not enjoying the times when I wasn't getting the results I wanted. Sports are full of far more failures than successes and you're only enjoying the smallest fraction of them if you are only able to enjoy success. I can

only think of a handful of successful moments from my sports career, yet I spent years participating in multiple sports. Enjoy every moment of your journey because if you sit around waiting for the big highlight moments in your career, you'll only enjoy a handful of days of the sports you love.

Currently, Coach Anderson is Co-Head Coach alongside Coach Chris Foerster, a former student and standout track athlete for Coach Anderson. Concussions: Do We Have a Treatment?

In 2022, do we have anything better for the brain after a concussion than just "rest"? Healing with Hyperbarics of North Dakota, PLLC thinks so. They have been treating concussions here in Fargo, using hyperbaric oxygen [HBO] treatments since 2018. Clinic founder, Daphne Denham MD FACS FACCWS, developed a "TREAT a concussion" protocol and the clinic has TREATed over 1000 concussions. Shanley graduate, class of 1982, Allan Luistro MD, is the current medical director at Healing with Hyperbarics.

With an estimated 3 million concussions (or mild traumatic brain injuries) occurring yearly, we need a solution. One of the biggest problems, the scariest aspect for parents of an injured child, is that there is not a standardized, accepted diagnostic tool; and worse, not an effective treatment. We have a solution, both to diagnose, and treat, a concussion. We need to appreciate the brain and its energy requirements to best understand concussions. Brain cells are like elite athletes; they function using oxygen and glucose to make energy and they use more of these resources than any other cells. A concussion typically causes an injury to brain cells, rather than complete cell death. These injured cells require dramatically more energy to repair themselves, but after a concussion, the brain receives less blood flow than normal meaning less oxygen and glucose to make energy. Therefore, at a time when these cells need more energy, they are getting far less than normal.



HBO treatments are simple, safe and the best way we can get oxygen into the injured tissue. A treatment involves breathing 100% oxygen in a medical grade chamber (pictured), at varying increased pressures, allowing one thousand percent more oxygen to dissolve into the liquid part of the blood. The resulting high oxygen does three basic things: it gets the needed increase of oxygen to the brain cells to allow them to repair; it decreases swelling of the tissues; and lastly it turns off the inflammatory response. A recent publication from early August 2022, in the Journal of American Medical Association (JAMA) looked at the outcomes of patients with mild traumatic brain injuries, or concussions. The study reviewed a total of 991 participants. At 2 weeks post-injury, 76% of these participants had an incomplete recovery defined as not returning to baseline or preinjury life. At 6 months 56% still had an incomplete recovery. This emphasizes the need to treat all concussions as soon as they are sustained and not wait for them to not get better.



We are using BrainScope, an FDA cleared device to help aid in diagnosing a concussion, to show HBO sessions are effective. BrainScope is an EEG based brain biomarker that produces a score between 0-100, with less than 70 being diagnostic of a concussion. [Greater than 70 and the student is cleared to return to play.] Over the years, many publications have described the prolonged recovery and multiple complications concussion patients have. Using the "TREAT a Concussion" protocol, we are seeing patients score above 70 after an average of less than 4 treatments, if the concussion is treated within the first week of injury. Often when 2 treatments are given a day, the concussion is resolved within 2 days. We are the only clinic in the area that is using the BrainScope data to aid in concussion diagnosis. We can also treat post-concussive symptoms with HBO, but it takes longer, and more treatments are needed. This is why it is important to see patients with concussions as soon as the injury is sustained: the result is fewer treatments and a far quicker recovery. We only have one brain to take us through life. What are we willing to do to repair and protect that brain?






